## THE MCFARLANE FAMILY

Sometime along about 1600 when the first colonies were preparing to come to America, a part of the Scottish Clan of McFarlane emigrated to Ireland. The wherefore and why of the move is not known. Here they lived for several generations,, intermarrying with the Irish to be sure, but still holding to their clan.

Then came the colonization of America and the stories of wonderful wealth to be had in this new country. It could not be resisted and so about 1700-1750 the McFarlane Clan was again broken when part of the members left Dunganon and came to America. In America they settled in Pennsylvania which was then somewhat on the frontier between the Indians and the Colonies.

Of these hardy pioneers who braved the seas and the early life of the colonies, we know very little of what they did or what they were, but of their children we know more. Of these we know of James McFarlane, Annie McFarlane, John McFarlane, Andrew McFarlane, and Francis McFarlane.

From authentic sources it is said that Francis McFarlane was the youngest of twenty-one children, two of which were girls. Only part of the family came to America.

21. James McFarlane was born about 1751, and was one of the early pioneers of Pennsylvania. He made his livelihood by means of his gun, being for the most part a hunter or trader, and he led a rather roaming life. He helped his brother, Andrew, for a time when they ran a store and trading post near Pittsburg. Then at the time of the Revolution he organized a small company of militia to protect the settlement but they later became part of the main army and he was commissioned a Major by Washington for his services. After the war he remained in the army. He was Killed July 17, 1794, during the whiskey rebellion of that time.

22. Annie McFarlane was born probably about 1765. She spent her life in Pennsylvania. She married Henry Robison and in 1793 they formed part of the party to go west as told in the History of Lewis County under 25. They are buried in Newcastle, Pennsylvania.

23. John McFarlane was a brother of Francis McFarlane. He never married but spent most of his life as a hunter and trader. He was killed by the Indians around Sandusky, Ohio, about 1814, between Youngstown and Warren, where he had been trading with them.



Z4. Andrew McFarlane was born probably about 1750 or earlier. The story of his life is best told in the article entitled "The Capture of Andrew McFarlane" taken from the Pittsburgh Dispatch of Sunday, Jan.1,1899, by E. W. Hassler, which reads as follows:

"After the beginning of the Revolution the first Indian depredation on the frontier of Westmoreland was the capture of Andrew McFarlane at Kittanning. Considerable interest attaches to McFarlane's history, as his decedents are numerous in western Pennsylvania and have occupied positions of prominence in several counties.

"McFarlane came from the County Tyrone to Philadelphia soon after the close of the French and Indian war, and made his way to Pittsburg, then a military post and frontier trading town of the rudest character. He engaged in the Indian trade and was joined by his brother James. In February, 1773, the Pennsylvania Government set up the county of Westmoreland, covering all the province west of Laurel Hill; but the beginning of the following year the Virginians seized Fort Pitt, claimed all the territory in its neighborhood and maintained their authority by calling out the militia. Pennsylvania had no militia law, but sought to retain her jurisdiction by appointing a large number of magistrates, who were expected to assert their authority without any means of enforcing it. Andrew McFarlane was one of the twenty-four Justices of the Peace for Westmoreland county, appointed by the Governor of Pennsylvania, January 19, 1774.

"John Connolly, with his Virginia militia, overawed the Pennsylvania court at Hannastown and arrested the three Pennsylvania justices who lived in Pittsburg. These were Andrew McFarlane, Devereux Smith and Captain Aeneas Mackay. They were taken as prisoners to Staunton, Va., and there detained four weeks, until released by the order of Governor Dunmore.

"On the evening of his arrest in Pittsburg, McFarlane managed to send a letter to the Governor of Pennsylvania, in which he said, 'I am taken at a great inconvenience, as my business is suffering much on account of my absence, but I am willing to suffer a great deal more rather than bring a disgrace upon the commission which I bear under your Honor.' One result of his arrest indicates that McFarlane did not really suffer much during his captivity at Staunton. In that town the young trader formed the acquaintance of Margaret Lynn Lewis, the daughter of William Lewis, one of the five brothers famous in the military history of Virginia. It must have been a case of love at first sight, for Andrew McFarlane and Miss Lewis were married that summer and she went with her husband to his log home at the frontier post at the forks of the Ohio.



"To escape from the exactions and persecution of the Virginia militia officers, Andrew and his brother moved their store in the autumn of 1774, from Fort Pitt to Kittanning. This was the site of an old Indian town on the Allegheny. It was in the northwestern corner of Westmoreland county and was the extreme limit of white settlement in that direction. At that time probably not more than half a dozen settlers lived there.

"Joseph Speer, another Pennsylvania trader, established a branch store at Kittanning, and the two trading houses soon built up a vigorous fur trade with the Indians on the tributaries of the Upper Allegheny. When the Revolution came the McFarlanes were prospering.

"During the first and second years of that strife the people of the western frontier hoped that they would not be molested by the savages. Treaties were held at Fort Pitt with the chiefs of the Ohio Indians and the Senecas who dwelt on the Allegheny and these chiefs promised to remain neutral. These promises were broken under the instigation of British agents and Tories at the posts on the Great Lakes. The first sign of trouble appeared among the Iroquois in New York, in the autumn of 1776. In July, 1776, the Continental Congress ordered the raising of a regiment, consisting of seven companies from Westmoreland and one company from Bedford, to build and garrison forts at Kittanning, Le Boeuf and Erie, to protect that region from British and Iroquois attacks by way of Lake Erie. This battalion of frontier riflemen was raised rapidly and following officers were appointed to its command: Colonel, Aeneas Mackay; Lieutenant Colonel, George Wilson; Major, Richard Bultor. After its formation it went into camp at Kittanning and there was preparing for an advance up the Allegheny to build the two other forts, when a call was received to march eastward across the state of Pennsylvania and join the hard-pressed army of General Washington on or near the Delaware.

"This call reised a storm of protest on the frontier but it was not to be disobeyed, and early in January, 1777, Colonel Mackay's regiment, afterward known as the gallant Eighth Pennsylvania, set out on its long and disastrous march across the mountains.

"At that time many persons, not well informed, thought the frontier was not in danger but this was not the belief of Andrew McFarlane and his neighbors living at the exposed settlement of Kittanning. Immediately after the departure of Colonel Mackay's regiment, Magistrate McFarlane wrote to the commissioners of Westmoreland county, begging that a company of militia be sent to Kittanning. He feared that the Iroquois would attack the little settlement. His neighbors were uneasy and he said that he remained only to



keep them from running away. It seems, however, that most of the other settlers at Kittanning did run away during the winter for in February, when McFarlane was taken the only other men at the place were two servants in charge of Joseph Speer's store.

"It appears that no militia was at once available to occupy Kittanning and guard the stores left there by Colonel Mackay. In this emergency, Samuel Moorhead, who lived at Black Lick Creek, north of the Kiskiminetas, began the formation of the company volunteer rangers for frontier protection. He chose McFarlane as his lieutenant and these two men were at work during the winter trying to embody the scattered settlers into a small company.

The story of McFarlane's capture is preserved in two forms. One is gathered from letters written at the time, while the other is a tradition handed down in the Lewis family of Virginia. These two accounts illustrate the frailty of tradition as a source of historical narrative. No tale transmitted by word of mouth for two or three generations is to be relied upon unless corroborated by contemporary documents, though the tradition often forms the more interesting story. I give the tradition first and the authentic account afterward. The Lewis story is now preserved in a history of Lynchburg, Va., and runs thus:

"When Margaret Lynn Lewis married Mr. McFarlane, of Pittsburg, and left the parental roof, she traveled through a wilderness infested with hostile Indians till she reached that place, where they did not consider themselves safe, constantly expecting attacks from Indians. Once, when they least apprehended danger, a warhoop was heard, her husband taken prisoner, the tomahawk raised and she averted her eyes to avoid witnessing the fatal stroke. The river was between them and she, with her infant and maid servant, of course endeavored to fly knowing the inevitable consequences of delay. After starting the servant reminded Mrs. McFarlane of her husband's money and valuable papers, but she desired the girl not to mention anything of that sort at such a moment; but, regardless of the commands of her mistress, the servant returned to the dwelling, bringing all of the money and as many of the papers as she could hold in her apron, overtaking, in a short time, her mistress as the snow was three feet deep. On looking back she saw the house in flames, and pursuing their journey, they, with incredible fatigue, reached the house of Colonel Crawford, a distance of fourteen miles.

"Through the space of three years the brave heart of this remarkable woman was buoyed up with the firm hope and belief that she should again behold her beloved husband alive, and at length she receive intelligence that he had



been carried captive to Quebec, where he had encountered incredible hardships; but the chiefs agreed that for a heavy ransom he might be restored to his friends. So of course, this ransom was paid with the greatest alacrity, his brother going on and returning with Mr. McFarlane to Staunton. In a short time the husband and wife returned to their desolated home at Pittsburg, where they found literally nothing left, the Indians having destroyed house, stock and everything pertaining to their establishment. They rebuilt their dwelling in the same spot and for many years they happily and peacefully resided there, leaving a large family, all respectably settled about Pittsburg, with the exception of two sons, who engaged in the fur trade."

The contemporary account of this event is found in letters from the frontier, written to the officers of the Pennsylvania Government at Philadelphia and made public in recent years. The British authorities, in Canada who were preparing to send rangers and Indians against the western Pennsylvania border, wished to get a reliable account of the situation in the neighborhood of Fort Pitt and decided to send down a small party to take a prisoner and carry him to Canada, that he might be examined.

His capture was undoubtedly seen by his wife and by two other men at the settlement, but it is not likely that a tomahawk was brandished over his head. The Indians had orders to treat their captive as kindly as possible and return quickly with him to Niagara. To that point McFarlane was hurried, through the deep snow, and there he was subjected to the most rigid examination concerning the condition of the frontier defenses. He was then taken to Quebec. His capture caused great alarm on the border and stimulated the frontiersmen to the enrolling of the militia. Captain Moorhead hurried with his recruits to Kittanning and took charge of the houses and stores there, and all along the border preparations were made to repel the expected attacks of the savages, which came quickly with the opening of spring.

It is probable that Mrs. McFarlane did flee from Kittanning after the capture of her husband, for there was every reason to expect an Indian attack; but the place where she took refuge could not have been the house of Colonel Crawford. That gentleman lived at New Haven, on the Youghiogheny river, nearly 60 miles away in a straight line. At the time of the capture Crawford was in Maryland, on a journey to Philadelphia. Fourteen miles would have taken the fugitives to a little settlement of two or three huts at the mouth of the Kiskiminetas river, but the nearest place of refuge was Carnahan's blockhouse, not less than twenty miles south of Kittanning. The Lewis tradition knows nothing of Kittanning but located the event in the immediate vicinity of Pittsburg.



At the time of Andrew's capture his brother, James, was a Lieutenant in the First Pennsylvania, under General Washington. It was through his efforts that Andrew was exchanged, in the fall of 1780. The released man rejoined his wife and child at Staunton, and they soon afterward returned to the vicinity of Pittsburg. Kittanning was now deserted and exposed to frequent Indian raids, and Andrew McFarlane opened a store on Chartiers creek, within the present limits of Scott township, where he lived for many years. During the later years of the Revolution he was a Commissioner of Purchases for the Continental troupes serving on the border.

His oldest son, Andrew, doubtless the infant whom Mrs. McFarlane carried in her arms when she fled from Kittanning, became one of the pioneer settlers on the Shenango, near the present New Castle, and his descendants are numerous in Lawrence county. He was the father of twelve children. His youngest child, Colonel Andrew Lewis McFarlane, died near Irwin, Westmoreland county, October 19, 1898, at the age of 77. He removed from New Castle to Westmoreland when young, engaged in the coal business and acquired a considerable fortune. For some years he was superintendent of the Westmoreland Coal Company. His widow and one son, Andrew Lewis McFarlane, Jr., live on the old homestead, about one mile from Irwin. The other children are Mrs. Thomas Boggs, living in Ohio, George L. McFarlane of Pittsburg, who has just been elected for a third term as a member of the General Assembly for the Fifth district of Allegheny county, and Mrs. William Stenton, of the East End, Pittsburg.

James McFarlane, the Revolutionary officer, was a bachelor. His sword, which he carried on many battle fields became the property of his nephew, Andrew, and has descended to Andrew McFarlane, Jr. It is a fine weapon and is highly prized by its present possessor. Andrew and James McFarlane had a brother Francis, who came to Western Pennsylvania after the Revolution.

Margaret Lynn Lewis McFarlane, wife of Andrew McFarlane was a granddaughter of John Lewis of Virginia. John Lewis was the first of the Lewis's to come to America. He and his wife, Margaret Lynn, a daughter of the Chieftain of Loch Lynn are buried two miles east of Staunton and the inscription on the tomb states that "he located the town, settled Augusta county, and furnished five sons to fight the battles of the American Revolution." He is the ancestor of the many Scotch-Irish Lewises of Virginia.

Of their life and the part they played in the history of our country we quote from the history of Lawrence County, published in 1877.

"In June of 1793, a party of about 45 persons left Allegheny City and started for the valley of the Mahoning, intending to settle on the north side of the river. They brought with them a surveyor named Arthur Gardner, who considered himself competent to locate the lands on which they intended to settle. They came down the Ohio river to the mouth of the Beaver river and then up that stream on the east side. Somewhere, about the mouth of Conoquessing Creek stood a block house, garrisoned by a small company of men commanded by a lieutenant. Here the travelers stopped and inquired about the region into which they were going. The lieutenant told them he knew of considerable numbers of Indians that were prowling around, and if they went it must be at their own risk, as he would not promise to help them out of any difficulty because his force was so small. They proceeded on their way and happily were not molested.

"About the place where the city of New Castle now stands they forded the Shenango, and went to the westward. In some manner they passed the state line and brought up on the spot where Youngstown, Ohio, now stands. At this time many of the party became dissatisfied and returned to Allegheny. The rest, some seventeen in number, came back into Pennsylvania and finally settled on farms on both sides of the Mahoning river instead of adhering to the plan of settling on the north side only. Among those forming this party were, Francis McFarlane, James, John and George McWilliams, John Small, Henry Robinson, Edward Wright, Alexander McCoy and Arthur Gardner, the latter being the survey who probably made no claim. They settled in what is now Mahoning Township. In 1793 they made "deadenings", built cabins, planted apple and peach seeds and made other arrangements necessary for their future comfort. After completing their improvements they returned to Pittsburg and in 1794 most of them brought out their families."



Francis McFarlane after putting a man on his farm in Mahoning Township came to Pulaski Township in 1796 and located on 500 acres and after that time making it his permanent home during the rest of his life. He had three children when he came.

Francis McFarlane and James Murray were captains during the Indian troubles which General Wayne finally put an end to. These men had charge of companies who were kept under arms to protect the frontier posts. They were called "minute men" and served out three commissions each, from the Governor of Pennsylvania before the Indian troubles were ended.

Francis McFarlane died January 15, 1846 and his wife Mary McWilliams McFarlane, January 18, 1858, aged 84 and 81 years respectively. They are buried in Deercreek Cemetery, about one-half mile north of New Bedford, Lawrence Co., Pa.

This is the family of John McFarlane, eldest son of Francis McFarlane, born 1794 and a brother of Irwin McFarlane. He came to Western Pennsylvania at the age of four, riding horseback behind his mother. He served in the war of 1812.

John McFarlane married Elizabeth Davidson and they made their home in Pennsylvania. He died in 1873. They were the parents of seven children.

# THE DICKSON FAMILY.

The Dickson family is the only family in which we are able to go back to any great length. From records obtained and kept by Mrs. Sallie Dickson Park of Los Angeles, we find that a certain David Dickson, D.D.I., was Professor of Theology in the Edinburgh and Glasgow Seminary at Edinburgh, Scotland, about 1666. From a book published in 1837 by Robert Carter and Bros., 520 Broadway, N.Y., entitled "Martyrs and Covenanters of Scotland," tells of Dr. Dickson's religious activity in Scotland. He tried to spread the gospel to the market people and was extremely successful in his evangelistic work besides his school work. At one time was banished by the High Commission Court to Turiff, in the north of Scotland, for religious reasons, but was restored again through the efforts of friends. He was the author of a number of theological treatises, which it is said are used as references today.

He had one son of which we have record, John Dickson I, who was a dry goods merchant in Edinburgh, Scotland. He had two sons,
